GOOD EVENING. At 7:00 PM Central (Daylight) (Standard) Time, 0000 (0100) Coordinated Universal Time, this is the North Shore Emergency Association's weekly Radio Net. Are there any stations with emergency or priority traffic? Net Control standing by

Net control this evening is (station) _____, (call sign) _____. The net is being conducted on the 462.675 Park Ridge GMRS repeater, KAA 8142, and 450.2875 Shadow Traffic repeater, KPJ 758. The primary purposes of the net are: to maintain weekly radio contact with members and affiliates of NSEA; to announce items of information between meetings; and to insure radio equipment and system operation are maintained in case of emergency. The net also serves to unite associate groups, other GMRS operators and affiliated participants on the Shadow Traffic system for public service, emergency and disaster communications.

Many GMRS operators are involved in public service activities such as, SKYWARN weather spotting, REACT, Red Cross Disaster Service, and other volunteer communications projects. NSEA has been involved in such activities for many decades and encourages and invites all GMRS operators and authorized users of the Shadow Traffic System to check into this net. Individuals interested in gaining access to the net via the Shadow Traffic System or affiliating with NSEA are welcome to contact Net Control, any NSEA member on GMRS, or may visit our website, www.NSEA.com.
